Woodlawn & Pope-Leighey House sits on 126 acres of a former plantation. Woodlawn was built in 1805 for George Washington's step-granddaughter, Nelly Custis Lewis.

Pope-Leighey House was designed by Frank Lloyd Wright and moved here in the 1960s from its original site in Falls Church, VA.

The Woodlawn event space includes a permanent oyster-shelled tent pad. The luxury tent, which is installed on the property from April to November, includes chandelier lighting, draped tent liner, and sides that open up.



For weddings, couples can choose one of our outdoor ceremony locations, which is then followed by a garden cocktail party and tented reception.











Our large Event Tent on site can accommodate up to 250 guests and is coordinated with our two catering partners, Main Event Caterers and Design Cuisine.















Frank Lloyd Wright's Pope-Leighey House is an intimate space for smaller gatherings. Built in 1940, the home is a beautiful example of the famed architect's mid-century Usonian style.
